


Jui-Hsiang (Ricky) Su

Ricky is a current serving Royal Australian Army Chaplain with over 20 years of military service, initially, as a Physiotherapy Officer before Corps transferring to Army Chaplaincy.



Ricky has been in Christian ministry since 2010. He was a Student Pastor (Young Adults) at Narwee Baptist Church, Senior Student at Morling College, Associate Pastor (Families) and then, Acting Senior Pastor at Hornsby Baptist Church. Ricky has attended many Baptist churches in various states (NSW, VIC, WA and NT) due to postings in the Australian Army.

Ricky has been posted to various units – Health, Military Engineering, Infantry, Combined Arms and Special Forces. Currently, Ricky is a Team Leader who supervises six chaplains across two states. Ricky was often the first responder to critical incidences. For his pastoral work, he was awarded the Conspicuous Service Medal in the Australia Day 2021 Honours, his citation reads, 'For meritorious achievement in leadership, pastoral support and welfare management within the Australian Army'.

Ricky is an Afghanistan and Iraq veteran who has also served in domestic operations. In Iraq, he extended his chaplaincy support to the Coalition Forces when they sustained multiple fatalities. For his leadership and contributions, he was awarded the United States Army Commendation Medal.

Ricky is passionate about pastoral care, leadership and sustainability in ministry. He completed his Graduate Certificate of Professional Pastoral Supervision in 2022 and he is an AAOS Associate Member. Currently, Ricky is completing his Master of Social and Organisational Leadership from Charles Sturt University.

Ricky offers a confidential space where the supervisee feels supported and nurtured in order to conduct reflective practice to explore self and ministry in their contexts and to achieve a fuller realisation of their purpose, ministry and life.
